



## **Guidelines for the Administration of the Two's Competitions**

These guidelines are to be used for the administration of "Two's Competitions" in relation to Gentlemen's competitions only.

Any "Two's Competitions" held by the Ladies or Dad's Army Sections will be administered by those sections under their own rules and guidelines.

### **Cost of Two's Competition Entry**

The cost of the entry fee to Two's Competitions will be as set by the relevant Club Committee from time to time.

### **Administration of Two's Competition Prize Pots**

An individual "prize pot" will be created for each separate competition, and the combined total all "two's entry fees" will form the basis of the pot.

At the end of each individual competition the total funds in the prize pot will be divided by the total number of two's scored in the competition (subject to the rules relating to any Hole(s)-in-One scored, as detailed below), and this will create a prize value per two scored. The prize value per two will then be rounded down to the nearest whole pound, and the resultant value will be credited to the BRS account of each competitor scoring a two in the competition. Any competitor who achieves multiple twos in a competition will receive the relevant credit for each two scored.

Any golfer scoring a Hole-in-One during a relevant competition will receive a special prize equivalent to the cost of one dozen good quality golf balls per Hole-in-One achieved, and the cost of such a prize(s) shall be deducted from the balance held in the two's pot for that competition, and the remaining balance in the pot will then be divided by the total number of two's scored in the competition which will create an adjusted prize value per two scored, subject to such a prize being rounded down to the nearest whole pound. The adjusted value per two scored will then be credited to the BRS account of the relevant competitor, as outlined above.

Any surplus balance created as a result of the rounding down process will be transferred to the general competitions fund.

In normal circumstances a two scored on any hole will be counted towards a payment from the prize pot, but the relevant Club Committee have discretion to remove any hole or holes from any two's competition, for example, a winter 4BBB competition or Texas Scramble competition may see holes such as the 10<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> excluded from the two's competition.

Any complaint or discrepancy raised in relation to the administration of the Two's Competition will be investigated by the relevant Club Committee, and their decision shall be final.
